'99 winners repeat in three of four divisions

Yogi Berra would have loved this year's 24th Annual Labor Day Road Race.

With repeat winners in the both the men's and women's 10K, the men's 5K, the men's 5K Masters, four 5K age groups and seven 10K age groups, it definitely felt like *deja vu* all over again.

In the signature event, it was Atlantian Sue Kelly winning her third straight 10K with a time of 36 minutes, 45 seconds. The time was well off her 35:57 pace a year ago, but the severe humidity likely played a role in the difference. Despite the slower pace, Kelly still won by nearly five minutes over Douglasville's Sherri Hintz, who finished second behind Kelly by

almost six minutes last year.

Alan Black was the repeat winner in the men's 10K. Black actually shaved 11 seconds off last year's time, finishing at 31:32, his 22nd win in 24 races this year.

Black conceded that conditions were tougher this year, but the race was much closer too, which is why he was able to take a few seconds off his time. Black beat Adam Pinkston by more than two minutes last year. Monday, he held off Kenneth McLeod by only 18 seconds.

"I had a pretty good pace going

early," the 26-year-old Black said of his personnel-best time. "I felt good all day. It was a lot of fun, even though it was so humid."

Black probably won't defend his title next year. He's been working on shorter races to try to make the 2004 Olympic team as a miler and plans to take 10Ks off his schedule next year. He did say, however, he would come back for the 5K in Macon, a race he won in 1997.

In Monday's 5K, Michael Strickland repeated as champion in 15:27, just holding off Ben Leonard (15:52) and Mark Coughlin (15:56). Trish Vlastnik took advantage of the absence of two-time champion Kathy Perez-Wolski to claim the crown in a

personal-best of 19:02, shaving 15 seconds off her 10th place finish last year. Kelly Bloom, 15 and a student at Brookwood High School in Snellville, finished second in 19:18.

"I really like this course," the 47-year-old Vlastnik from Peachtree City said. "I set a PR (personal record) here last year, and I did it again today. After the one big hill, it's mostly down hill, so you can make some good times."

Personal records weren't the only marks set Monday.

Clarence Hartley, 71, ran the 5K in 21:18, setting a state record for men over 70. On Hartley's entry form for the race, he wrote that he planned to break the old record of 22:13.

Making the record even more special for Hartley, a Young Harris resident, was having his wife, children and grandchildren at the race.

"They live in Atlanta, so when I run I try to do it around there or up in North Georgia near our house," said Hartley, who runs about two races per month. "It was special having them all here for this."

The Hartley family wasn't the only one celebrating the holiday together. The Ashcrofts of Cochran had another winning

day at the race.

In the 5K, 10-year-old Kyle won the 10-and-under group for the third-straight year, and his 8-year-old brother, Cody, finished third in the group. Kyle's time of 21:50 was a personal best and 25 seconds faster than his time last year.

Other repeat age-group champions in the 5K included John Kirksey in the 35-39 group, Arnita Harris (60-64) and Violet Carden (75 and over). In the 10K, Lacy Gardner (11-14), Jackie Potkulski (35-39), Chuck Howard (35-39), Anne Wright (55-59), Russ Brown (55-59), Joyce Hodges-Hite (60-64) and Lloyd Chambers (65-69) all defended their age group titles from last year.
