1994 Pinkston dedicates victory to father

The sun had barely peeped over the tops of the houses on Ridge Avenue when Adam Pinkston put both feet on the starting line and his father in his heart.

"This one is for my dad," he said. "He has been my biggest fan

since I started running."

A.L. "Pop" Pinkston was waiting for his son near the finish line. He has been a dedicated volunteer at 16 of the 18 Labor Day Road Races.

And nothing could wipe the smile off his face when he saw his son gliding and striding into Central City Park at the head of the pack in the 10-kilometer (6.2-mile) newly named Olympic Labor Day Road Race.

This wasn't Pinkston's fastest race, but it was his most special. The 32-year-old Macon native, who now lives in Asheville, N.C., became the first three-time winner of the event. He dedicated the victory to his 75-year-old father.

"He gave us a scare earlier this year," Pinkston said. "They found some cancer in his nose. They think they got most of it with the radiation treatments. But I wanted

Pinkston crossed at 31:36, more than a minute ahead of his nearest competition. Robert Gerrard of Savannah was second at 32:57. Ricky Austin of Spring Garden, Ala., was third with a 33:44

Jill Hargis of Atlanta celebrated her 34th birthday by winning the women's 10K with a time of 36:57. Suni Heaton of Macon was second with a personal-best 37:26. Connie Robertson of Hapeville, the 1988 5K winner, finished third at 38:07.

A total of 1,693 runners from 11 states participated in the 10K and 5K events. They were greeted by near-perfect weather as they hit the streets. The temperature at the start of the 5K race at 7:15 a.m. was a cool 58 degrees.

Pinkston was a two-time region cross country champion at Central. He later ran cross country at Georgia State. He now manages an outdoor supply store in Asheville.

"He started running when he was 14, and we set up a one-mile track over on Lake Valley Road," said A.L. Pinkston. "We bought a stop watch and started keeping his

times. It's very special to see him come back to his hometown to run and win this race. Everybody knows him.'

Pinkston said the inaugural Labor Day event in 1977 came early in his running career and was only his second race. He has competed in all but one of the races, crossing the finish line first in 1986 and 1991.

"I-had a good race today, but not a great one," he said. "I thought it would be much faster after the first mile, but I was slow. Of course, Ralph Boston (former Olympic gold medalist and the official starter) was in the car ahead of me, so I couldn't slow down too

On his left thigh, Pinkston sported a new tattoo of cartoon character Bugs Bunny running. A mile into the race, it was "that's all folks" for the rest of the 10K

Hargis, a first-time participant, knew nothing about the course or her competition going into the race.

"I had hoped to be in the top five," she said. "I was running pretty even with (Heaton) the first mile before I started to pull ahead. I wasn't really sure who she was, but I heard a lot of people cheering for her so I figured she was the local favorite. It was fantasy of mine to win this in my first race here. I'm happy I

1994 McWhorter wins fourth

Ken McLeod and McWhorter weren't even going to run in Monday's Olympic Labor Day Road Race.

Although they were battling colds, McLeod and McWhorter somehow had enough energy to easily win the men's and women's 5K portion of the 18th annual event.

McWhorter, 30, who is from Atlanta, won her fourth consecutive women's 5K in 17:25. Marcia Wentworth set the women's record of 16:58 in 1989.

McWhorter had been contemplating not defending her championship after she got sick last week. Even after deciding to run, she was thinking more about surviving than winning.

ever, some of McLeod's friends coaxed him into running.

"They kept telling me I needed to run, so I listened and it paid off," said McLeod, 31.

McLeod hung with a pack for the first half-mile but broke loose and coasted the rest of the way, finishing in 15:00, about 75 meters ahead of second-place John Kirksey (15:11).

Marty Flynn set the men's 5K record of 14:19 in 1989.

After coming close to winning last year's race, McLeod didn't want to let this one slip away. When McLeod rounded the curve with a quarter-mile left, he picked up speed to lengthen his margin. The smile on his face told the sto-

"It felt good to finally win it," McLeod said. "Last year, I had led the whole way and lost it in the last 100 meters.'

Stone Mountain's Lee Fidler, who won the 10K in the first Labor Day Road Race in 1977, was just as strong 17 years later, taking the masters title in 16:09. Fidler, 45, was 38 seconds ahead of his closest competitor.
